Introduction

The following pages set out the pastoral plan of the parish for the period 2019 to 2022.

The plan follows the approach described in the diocesan guidelines as reissued in 2017: *Mission, Vision, Objectives, Action Steps, Accountability, Evaluation.*

The Council has set the Mission and Vision, the overall Goals to be sought, the main Objectives to be pursued to achieve each Goal, one or more Action Steps to realise each Objective and appropriate Measures to evaluate the outcome.

As the diocesan guidelines expect a pastoral council to be a deliberative rather than a management body, the day to day management and delivery of the Goals is delegated to the Council's pastoral committees as follows:

Here is a summary of the way the Council and each committee will work to deliver that part of the plan for the Goal delegated to the committee:

Committee:

- takes action to arrange one or more agreed Action Steps to achieve each Objective;
- agrees how each Action Step is to be performed, and who is to be accountable; and
- sets a deadline for each Action Step to be completed.

Council:

- ensures that the resources required by the committee are made available;
- takes all reasonable steps within its power to ensure the continued validity of the assumptions on which delivery of the plan is based;
- regularly monitors the performance of the committee in achieving the Objectives assigned to it;
- evaluates the effectiveness of each Action Step taken against the relevant Measure; and
- remains with overall responsibility for delivery of the entire plan.
