Pastor's Column 4th Sunday of Easter 2024 (Good Shepherd Sunday)

It is said that men follow courage. It is also said that a young man wants three things: a leader to follow, a battle to fight and a woman to impress. If we do "exegesis" allowing the Biblical text speak for itself, rather than a modern tendency to do " eisegesis" - reading into the text one's own philosophical or ideological agendas, we discover a Jesus who would impress, attract and challenge any young man to be the best and aim for the highest; uncompromising, direct and vibrantly courageous. Scripture is full of paradoxes; another figure looms large from the Old Testament, Jesus' Kingly ancestor, David. A careful reading of Scripture reveals a Janus-figure, two sides of the one coin. David is one of the few characters which the Bible describes physically, " ruddy, with beautiful eyes and a handsome appearance! " (1 Samuel 16: 12) His ascribed psalmody captures a passionate, sensitive heart. David had intense personal charisma. It explains why so many in his story fell in love with him. David's shadow side is as dark as his charisma was bright. The simple and evidential truth was David, Father and Shepherd King of Israel was a, blood-thirsty opportunist, an unparalleled historical Mafia Don, ambitious, treacherous and without pity. It is unsurprising that in his old age he was always cold, could never get warm. It is one of the great contrasting Biblical paradoxes that Jesus should be born of David's kingly line through his foster-father, Joseph. The image of the Shepherd King is paradoxical too. The Shepherd of psalm 23 carries in one hand a crook, for guiding and rescuing and a rod, a sturdy club for dealing with predators; both/and, not either-or! Jesus the Shepherd King, the one and only High Priest, is the model for the Catholic priest. Jesus is the priest, the lamb of sacrifice and the altar. As already alluded to, an unvarnished reading of the Gospels reveals Jesus as a man of electric power, steely courage and focused masculine energy. He is a man of great personal magnetism. He embodies the best of manhood; wild, with shamanic healing powers, a patriarch, trickster and warrior, a King and Shepherd, God in the flesh.

Explaining parts of the Mass, an excerpt from YOUCAT (Youth Catechism of the Catholic Church)

In what way is the Holy Eucharist an anticipation of eternal life?

Jesus promised his disciples, and us with them, that we will one day sit at table with him. Therefore every Holy Mass is a "memorial of the blessed Passion" (Eucharistic Prayer I, called the Roman Canon), the fullness of grace, and a pledge of future glory.
