Visiting Pastor's Column: 19th Sunday 2019

The Church is Synodal!

Your parish priest in his Pastor's Column for 6 July 2019 wrote of Jesus' sending out of the 72 and he went on to assert: "Lumen Gentium, a key document of Vatican Council 2, in Chapter 3, clearly articulates the hierarchic nature of the Church; we are not essentially conciliar, synodal or congregationalist." I disputed one part of the statement and he cunningly invited me to write a "quest" Pastor's column about the point at issue.

I agree that the Catholic Church is hierarchical – lay people, priests, bishops, Pope –a parish looks to its parish priest, a diocese to its bishop, the college of bishops to the Pope. This has been key for the *unity* of the Church. Ignatius of Antioch, writing the Church of Smyrna in 115 AD put it like this

Flee from division as the beginning of evils. You must all follow the bishop as Jesus Christ followed the Father, and follow the council of presbyters as you would the apostles; respect the deacons as the commandment of God. Let no one do anything that has to do with the church without the bishop.

However, the Church has always had meetings, synods, gatherings, councils – especially of bishops. The first synod of the civilised world – the Council of Nicaea met in 325 AD very shortly after Christianity became a tolerated religion. In the fifth canon of the Council they say:

Let an inquiry be held to ascertain whether anyonehas been expelled from the community because of pettiness or quarrelsomeness or any such ill nature on the part of the bishop. Accordingly, in order that there may be proper opportunity for inquiry into the matter, it is agreed that it would be well for synods to be held each year in each province twice a year, so that these inquiries may be conducted by all the bishops of the province assembled together ...

A huge number of synods have been held at local level in the history of the Church, and twenty-one ecumenical councils. Local synods were rarer in recent centuries, until Vatican II promoted them yet again.

The holding of councils in order to settle conjointly, in a decision rendered balanced and equitable by the advice of many, all questions of major importance; all this points clearly to the collegiate character and structure of the episcopal order. (Lumen Gentium 22).

This notion of listening to "the advice of many" is something that Pope Francis has been pushing. He stresses that the Holy Spirit is not restricted to working from the top down through the hierarchy, the Spirit is at work everywhere. In a ceremony celebrating the 50th anniversay of the re-establishment of Synods of Bishops after Vatican II he affirmed the importance of synods and synodality:

A synodal Church is a Church which listens, which realizes that listening "is more than simply hearing". It is a mutual listening in which everyone has something to learn. The faithful people, the college of bishops, the Bishop of Rome: all listening to each other, and all listening to the Holy Spirit, the "Spirit of truth" (John 14:17), in order to know what he "says to the Churches" (Rev 2:7).

We are a Church that expresses clear teachings through a strong teaching authority. Pope Francis, our centre of unity, is asking us to also be a listening Church. In our history we have often shut down debate and discouraged questioning at all levels from parish to global Church. Our teaching can become hollow if it is out of touch with the world in which we live. The members of the Church can be infantalized or alienated if they are constantly talked down to. The structures within our Church that give people a voice – parish meetings, parish councils, diocesan synods, synods of bishops – ought be cherished and developed. Guest columnists in the Parish newsletter are a good idea, too!
